In Phonics, we will continue to practise the skills of blending and segmenting. We will revisit Phase 2 and move onto Phase 3 of Letters and Sounds. High frequency words will be sent home to develop your child's sight vocabulary. Please support your child as they learn to read. Encourage them to sound out a word and use the pictures for contextual clues and prompts. Home learning books will be sent home every Wednesday. Work set will include a variety of practical and written activities to consolidate your child's learning at school. Please return the following Monday.
