### **BOOK FAIR**



The children really enjoyed the day and finally we were lucky with the weather. This half term has also seen more work carried out in the EYFS garden. We have had an extra slide put on the mound and this area has been re-turfed. The garden also has a vegetable patch next to the bottle greenhouse where we are currently growing runner beans. We have also moved the mud kitchen, which now has a sheltered canopy.

Our half term has ended with a number of Easter events including Easter egg hunts, baking and the annual Nursery Easter bonnet parade. We are all very much looking forward to the summer term and to enjoying the fine weather in our new garden and working with the children on their transition to Reception and to Year One.

### **NOTE FROM GOVERNORS**

The Board of Governors take our legal responsibilities to ensure Equality and Accessibility very seriously. In 2014 we put together our Plan for 2014-2017 and this has been recently reviewed. We are pleased to say that work on the website has been completed, delivered in a dyslexia friendly font, with Google translate and a high visibility facility for all those who need this. Two members of staff have received Makaton training. Makaton is now being used in the Early Years Classes enabling our children who are learning English and our non verbal children to fully access the learning environment and improve communication. In addition, Comic Sans font is being used in all the classrooms as this is considered to be dyslexia friendly.

Following the decision that we needed more class room space for Key Stage 2, the larger classroom for Hazel Class has been created and along with this a resources room.

We have a duty to constantly ensure that the school is safe and accessible for all. To this end, work has been completed in the reception area and fencing erected in the nursery area.

We must now congratulate Mr Price who has been appointed as a Deputy Headteacher elsewhere from September and so we will be seeking a new Early Years Leader and a Key Stage 1 Leader next. We have a record at St. Joseph's of recruiting very good teaching staff and they progress rapidly under Mr Coldwell's guidance and leadership.

### **SPORTING NEWS**

The boys have completed their football league with great success. They won it comfortably. All the boys played well as a team and demonstrated good sportsmanship; they should be proud of their achievement! The girls played in a friendly tournament and also fared well against the visiting schools.

The year 5 and 6 children are coming to the end of their term of tennis with Ali. A letter has gone out inviting year 1 and 2 children to attend the before school club starting after Easter.

Six children from KS1 and six children from LKS2 represented our school at the BSP Gymnastics competition. This is a very daunting competition as the calibre of performance is high and there is

individual pressure. The children are expected to memorise 2 routines and then perform these individually in front of a judge. Both teams did well and again should be proud of their work.

Summer term is upon us with lots of competitions and sports day so – get out and get active!



### **SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

At parents' evening you received your child's attendance record for this academic year. The government classes an attendance figure below 90% as 'persistently absent' and schools are being judged and measured against this. This equates to nineteen days off per school year. If this happened every year, your child would be over two terms behind in their learning at the end of Year 6.
