English Genres

<u>Stories From Other Cultures –</u> <u>Handa's Surprise</u>

In this unit, the children will explore aspects of another country and culture and compare these to their own experiences. They will learn to identify key events in a story through the use of a story map, write a first person recount and create a fact file on an African animal.

Non Chronological Reports - Bats In this non-fiction unit, the children will explore the different types of bat. They will then research these animals in order to create a non chronological report.

Letter Writing - Dear Greenpeace In this unit, the children will be focusing on the style, format and basic requirements of writing a letter. They will develop their awareness and appreciation of the joys of letter (and postcard) writing and receiving.

Poetry

In this unit, the children will listen to, read and perform a range of poems, developing their poetry knowledge and creating their own versions of a style.

Traditional Tales - Little Red

In this unit, the children will focus on recognising good and bad characters within a traditional tale, identify the story language in a familiar story and retell a traditional tale.

Comprehension

During this term, the children will continue comprehension lessons where they will learn the skills needed to read a text, understand the narrative and skim and retrieve to answer questions. and design a healthy meal made predominately from fuit and/or vegetables.

<u> PSHE – Relationships</u>

In this unit, the children will learn how to identify and maintain good friendships. They will also consider the importance of respect and compassion when dealing with other people.

PSHE - Changing Me

In this unit, the children will learn the ways in which each of us is unique. They will also learn about the basic changes that occur as we develop from babies to adults.

PE - Dance (Moving Words)

In this unit, the children will explore interpreting action words, movements and phrases and performing them through physical actions.

<u>PE - Games (Fundamentals Unit 2)</u> In this unit, the children will further develop the fundamental movement skills of: running, changing direction, catching, throwing, hitting a target. <u>Music</u>

The children will be following an adapted Music Express scheme covering the following topics: Story Time (Sounds), Pattern (Beat), Animals and Water (Pitch).

<u>Homework</u>

Weekly homework will be uploaded to Seesaw each Friday. The homework activities will alternate between English, Maths and a Foundation Subject. A Phonics activity will also be set each week. Once these have been completed at home, you will then need to upload a photo of your child's work by the following Thursday; this will enable it to be acknowledged and any necessary feedback given.

<u>Spellings</u>

Weekly spellings will also be uploaded to Seesaw each Friday. They will combine the phonic sounds (not the letter names) taught in school that week, and some Year 1 Common Exception Words. Please remember, five minutes spelling practice every night is much better than half an hour on the night before the test!

<u>Reading</u>

Although your child will be taught to read at school, you can have a huge impact on their reading journey by continuing to practise at home, preferably on a daily basis. There are two types of reading book that your child will bring home on a Friday:

- A reading practice book. This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.
- A sharing book. Your child will not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

Please return your child's reading practice book and reading record, **signed by an adult**, the following Wednesday. The sharing book can be returned the same day if you have finished enjoying it at home, if not, please continue to keep this book until your child is ready to change it.

Year 1 Expectations

- Please send only water in a small, named plastic bottle with a sport spout.
- All children must have a pair of soft named indoor shoes which will remain in school.
- The children will be provided with fruit/vegetables each day therefore they do not need to bring in anything from home for snack.
- Please label all of your child's school uniform, including their outer wear, to avoid confusion.
- We do not permit toys from home in school.
- Please ensure your child has a named school approved PE kit in order to participate fully in the twice-weekly lessons. This will be sent home each half term for washing. Full details of our school PE kit is available on the school website.
- Some of the children have a substantial number of keyrings on their bookbags. These can be rather cumbersome to store in the bag boxes, and quite dangerous. Please restrict these to one keyring only.
- We are unable to store wellies in our cloakroom. If your child wears wellies to school on a rainy day, please ensure they also bring in their outdoor school shoes.
- Girls will need to have a pair of socks in their PE bags if they wear tights for school.
- Headbands, clips or hairbands must be small and in line with our school colour.
- Children are **not** permitted to wear any electronic devices such as watches and fitbits.
- Please ensure your child's reading practice book and reading record are in their school bag *every day*.
