### Science

# Circle of Life

In this unit, the children look at life cycles of various species. They also look at and describe the life processes of reproduction in plants and animals (butterflies and frogs).

### Material World

In this unit, the children learn about materials and how they change. First they test properties of materials, before looking at how materials dissolve, what a solution is, and evaporation. Finally, the children compare reversible and irreversible changes.

### Computing

#### We are Artists

In this unit, the children will use vector and turtle graphics to explore geometric art, taking inspiration from the work of Escher, Riley and traditional Islamic artists, as well as experimenting with complex 'fractal' landscapes.

### We are Web Developers

In this unit, the children work together to create a website explaining online safety and responsible online behaviour. This will link to our D&T project.

### **History**

### What impact did The Anglo-Saxons have?

In this unit, the children will explore the world of the Anglo-Saxons, and why they came to Britain.

# Geography

### How is our country changing?

In this unit, the children will find out about the regions of the United Kingdom, discovering how some of these areas have changed over time. The children will focus on Bishop's Stortford collecting primary evidence from fieldwork.

### D&T

### Bread

In this unit, the children will investigate and learn about bread products, finding out how to make different breads. They will then design a new bread product and make bread based on a plan and design.

### 88 Pianists Project

The children will be working on a special project with the support of the University of Cambridge Engineering Department. A letter detailing this exciting opportunity will follow before half term.

#### Art

### Monet and the Impressionists

In this unit, the children will explore what Impressionism is and where it began. They will about Claude Monet and explore some of his paintings.

#### Music

Music lessons will follow the Music Express scheme and topics this term include:

Our community (composition and performance)
Solar System (listening and composition)

#### French

The children will develop language skills including, grammar, listening, speaking writing and reading. The topics covered this term include:

- Sports and physical activities
- Parts of the body

### **PSHE**

Enterprise week: 8<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> October. Each class will plan, design and make a product(s) which will subsequently be sold at the Enterprise Fair on the final day. The project gives the children the experience of 'economics' in that they need to work within a set budget, cost materials and agree a price which will ensure their goods sell and make a profit. All profits will be donated to a diocesan charity.
