The aspects covered will include some of the following topics:

- Fractions, (decimals and percentages Yr4)

## **Data Handling**

 Collecting, classifying and interpreting data in tally charts, frequency tables and pictograms

Lessons will also provide children with an opportunity to develop their mastery, application and fluency skills.

# **Swimming**

 This term Maple class will be swimming on Monday mornings (Please ensure all girls and children with longer hair have a swimming hat and remove any earrings)

#### **Team Games**

- To develop mobility and spatial awareness
- To develop a range of throwing and catching skills and techniques
- To develop tactical awareness

#### **Gymnastics:**

- Identify and use different body parts to balance on and know which combinations produce stable bases
- To travel and jump fluently and hold balanced positions demonstrating a variety of stretched and curled shapes.
- Floor and apparatus work

#### Music

Music lessons will follow the Music Express scheme of work and will cover a range of short topics including:

Poetry – Perform poetry using controlled expression and rhythmic speaking

Environment – Create descriptive compositions based on environmental themes

Sounds – Create and classify sounds.

Explore beatbox sounds and vocal rounds.

Recycling – Explore instruments made from junk. Learn about musical structures.

#### **History**

This term we will be learning about the similarities and differences between the Bronze and Iron Ages.

#### Geography

This term will be exploring the world's climate and weather conditions using geographic enquiry skills.

#### <u>Art</u>

In art, we will be studying the work of Andy Warhol and the pop art movement

# **Computing**

This term we will be following the Rising Stars Scheme, focusing on:

**We are communicators** (Email communications)

**HTML editors** (Learn about internet access and how to stay safe online. Begin to create and edit web pages using HTML)

#### D.T.

In design and technology lessons we will be investigating seasonal foods.

#### P.S.H.E

This will be addressed through crosscurricular topics and in-class discussions.

#### **General Information**

Please provide a water bottle and ensure that they are refreshed every day. Please ensure that all school uniform, including PE kit, is clearly labelled with your child's name. If you wish to speak with us, we will be available most days after school, except Wednesdays, but it is advisable to arrange an appointment with us. If you need to speak to us urgently in the morning we will be available for a quick chat as the registration period is very short. Please note that there is also a clipboard for urgent messages available for parents to write on if the teacher is busy.

#### Homework

All children will receive literacy and numeracy homework on alternate weeks.

**For Mathematics**: The children must learn their times tables facts daily to achieve instant recall. They will be tested on the times table they are individually learning. Please see booklet for details. Learning times tables are very important as these facts are used in nearly all mathematics lessons. There is an end of Year 4 assessment on times tables newly introduced by the government this year.

For English: Homework will compliment work covered in class during the term.

There will be a list of weekly spellings to learn and accompanying activities and online games to help make the learning more fun! Spellings (from our new spelling scheme) will be tested in school on a Friday. Please ensure that you hear your child read each evening (where possible) for 10-15 minutes focused time! Please ask them to retell what they have read in their own words, and where possible, to predict what might happen next.

#### **Uniform/Appearance**

We believe that the children should take pride in the way they present themselves e.g. shirt tucked in and top buttons done up. We *do not* permit hair gel, nail polish or jewellery besides plain studs and a watch and we would be grateful for your support in this matter. If hair is able to be tied up, then it should be at all times.

The children are expected to have clearly **named** indoor and outdoor shoes and a **named** P.E. kit.
