English

The aspects covered in weekly lessons will include the following topics:

- Months of the year/birthdays
- Simple everyday conversation

Science

This term we will be learning about:

Food and our Bodies

- Recognising food types
- Identifying parts of the human skeleton
- Recognising the importance of exercise

Looking at states

- Identifying the differences between solids, liquids and gases.
- Recognising reversible and irreversible changes

Music

This term we will be following an adapted Music Express scheme covering the following

Maths

Number (mental and written)

- Place value (ordering and comparing beyond 1000)
- Mental fluency
- Addition and subtraction formal methods
- Rounding and estimating
- Solving word problems
- Ongoing tables and related division facts

Shape and Measures

- Measurement comparing and converting units of measurements
- Time

Data Handling

Discrete and continuous data.

Lessons will also provide children with an opportunity to develop their mastery, application and fluency skills.

P.E.

Invasion Games

- To develop mobility and spatial awareness
- To develop a range of ball skills and control
- To develop tactical awareness

Gymnastics:

- Identify and use different body parts to balance on and know which combinations produce stable bases
- To travel and jump fluently and hold balanced positions demonstrating a variety of stretched and curled shapes.
- Floor and apparatus work

Andy Warhol and the Pop Art Movement

In art, we will be studying the life and work of Andy Warhol and the pop art movement. We will use examples of his ideas, colour choices and chosen subjects and create our own art work based upon them.

topics:

Poetry: To use voices to speak expressively and rhythmically and to create ostinato accompaniments to enhance their performances.

Environment: To create descriptive accompaniments and to learn how environment has inspired composers through the ages.

Sounds: To explore sound sources and classify them and to use voices to make beatbox sounds and to sing in rounds.

Recycling: To create instruments from recycled materials and to improvise and play 'junk' jazz music following different structures.

<u>History</u>

This term we will be learning

- To recognise the improvements and advancements in all aspects of life in the Bronze and Iron Ages in comparison to the Stone Age.
- To recognise similarities and differences between everyday life and the rituals of the Bronze and Iron Age people.

Geography

This term will be exploring 'Is climate cool?' and studying the world's climate and weather conditions using geographic enquiry skills. Children will explore human impact upon climate change and how people adapt to living in different regions of the world. This is especially poignant at the moment!

Computing

This term we will focusing on the topic:

We are communicators

- To understand how we communicate in a range of technological/digital ways
- To create an email and send it to another class or designated person.
- To be aware of internet safety at all times

D.T. (Design and Technology)

In design and technology lessons we will be investigating seasonal foods.

- To be aware of how some British foods are seasonal and how they are grown and produced.
- To understand the importance of having a balanced diet.

P.S.H.E/ R.S.E.

In year 4, we will explore the following themes in relation to our faith:

- Healthy lifestyles
- Keeping Safe
- Growing and Changing

General Information

Please provide a water bottle and ensure that they are refreshed every day. Please ensure that all school uniform, including PE kit, is clearly labelled with your child's name. If you need to contact us about something urgent then please do so via the school office, preferably by email.

Homework

All children will receive either English, maths or topic homework each week.

For Mathematics: The children must learn their times tables facts daily to achieve instant recall. They will be tested on the times table they are individually learning. Please see booklet for details. Learning times tables is very important as these facts are used in nearly all mathematics lessons. There is an official end of Year 4 assessment on times tables newly introduced by the government. **For English**: Homework will compliment work covered in class during the term.

There will be a list of weekly spellings to learn and accompanying activities and online games to help make the learning more fun! Spellings will be tested in school on a Friday. Please ensure that you hear your child read each evening (where possible) for 10-15 minutes focused time! Please ask them to retell what they have read in their own words, and where possible, to predict what might happen next.

Uniform/Appearance

We believe that the children should take pride in the way they present themselves e.g. shirt tucked in and top buttons done up. We do not permit hair gel, nail polish or jewellery besides plain studs and a watch and we would be grateful for your support in this matter. If hair is able to be tied up, then it should be at all times.

The children are expected to have clearly **named** indoor and outdoor shoes and a **named** P.E. kit.
