English

Fiction

Music

This term we will be following an adapted Music Express scheme covering the following topics:

Environment: To explore songs, poems and to create accompaniments and sound pictures.

Building: To explore songs, poems and to create accompaniments and sound pictures.

Sounds: To explore how sounds are classified and to explore timbre and texture through musical conversation.

Poetry: To use voice, body percussion, instruments and movement to create expressive performances.

History

In history, we will be learning about the Stone Age.

- -Identify the significant roles of monuments

Geography

This term, we will be exploring the world's climate and weather conditions using geographic enquiry skills.

P.S.H.E and RSE

These will be addressed through cross-curricular topics, in-class discussions and activities linked to the 'SCARF' scheme and 'Life to the full' scheme.

- -To recognise the role of volunteers in our local community.
- -To identify people responsible for keeping us safe.

RSE

- -To recognise the Sacraments of 'Reconciliation' and 'Baptism.'
- -To reflect on ourselves and the image of God.
- -Exploration of our relationships with others and our relationship with God.

General Information

Please provide a water bottle and ensure that they are refreshed every day. Please ensure that all school uniform, including PE kit, is clearly labelled with your child's name and that your child's PE kit is in school ready for them to access. If you wish to speak with us, we will be available most days after school, except Wednesdays, but it is advisable to arrange an appointment with us.

Homework

All children will receive English, maths and topic homework which will rotate on a weekly cycle.

Maths

The children must practise their times tables facts daily to achieve instant recall. They will be tested on the times table they are individually learning. Please see your child's time tables booklet for details and encourage your child to keep this in their bag so that adults in school can easily access them. Learning times tables are very important as these facts are used in nearly all maths lessons.

English

Homework will compliment work covered in class during the term.

There will be a list of weekly spellings to learn and online games can be found on Spelling Shed using your child's log in to help make the learning more fun! Spellings will be tested in school on a Friday.

Please ensure that you hear your child read each evening (where possible) for 10-15 minutes focused time! Please ask them to retell what they have read in their own words, and where possible, to predict what might happen next. Your child's reading record can be used to record a note of your reading with them at home but please make sure they are kept in your child's school bag so that adults in school can access them. We will use our own records in school when listening to your child read.

Uniform/Appearance

We believe that the children should take pride in the way they present themselves e.g. shirt tucked in and top buttons done up. We *do not* permit hair gel, nail polish or jewellery besides plain studs and a watch and we would be grateful for your support in this matter. If hair is able to be tied up, then it should be at all times.

Please ensure that your child has a pair of named indoor shoes (preferably plimsolls) and a pair of named outdoor shoes. For PE, a pair of named trainers may be worn.
