The purpose of this letter is to provide an overview of the work that your child will be undertaking in each area of the curriculum during this term. It is hoped that this information will enable you to prepare, support and reinforce your discussions with your child about their schoolwork. Please note that Mrs Hookham will teach Maple class a weekly topic and a French lesson as part of Thursday afternoon lessons and she will teach Hazel class a weekly topic and a French lesson as part of Thursday and Friday morning lessons and alternate Wednesday afternoons.

Music

This term we will be following an adapted Music Express scheme covering the following topics:

Environment: To explore songs and poems and to create accompaniments and sound pictures.

Building: To explore songs and poems and to create accompaniments and sound pictures.

Sounds: To explore how sounds are classified and to explore timbre and texture through musical conversation.

Poetry: To use voice, body percussion and instruments and movement to create expressive performances.

History

In history, we will be learning about the Stone Age.

- Compare different stages of the Stone Age and the progress made
- Explore family life
- Identify the significant roles of monuments

Geography

This term, we will be exploring the world's climate and weather conditions using geographic enquiry skills.

D.T.

In design and technology lessons we will be planning, making and evaluating sandwich snacks.

P.S.H.E and RSE

These will be addressed through cross-curricular topics, in-class discussions and activities linked to the 'SCARF' scheme and 'Life to the full' scheme.

General Information

Please provide a water bottle and ensure that they are refreshed every day. Please ensure that all school uniform, including PE kit, is clearly labelled with your child's name and that your child's PE kit is in school ready for them to access. Seesaw will be used by your child's teacher to check your child's homework. Any other messages (unrelated to homework) should be sent to us either via the office or discussed with us at collection time.

Homework

All children will receive English, maths and topic homework which will rotate on a weekly cycle.

For Maths: The children must practise their times tables facts daily to achieve instant recall. They will be tested on the times table they are individually learning. Please see booklet for details and encourage your child to keep this in their bag so that adults in school can easily access them. Learning times tables are very important as these facts are used in nearly all maths lessons.

English

Homework will compliment work covered in class during the term.

There will be a list of weekly spellings to learn and accompanying activities and online games to help make the learning more fun! Spellings will be tested in school on a Friday.

Please ensure that you hear your child read each evening (where possible) for 10-15 minutes focused time! Please ask them to retell what they have read in their own words, and where possible, to predict what might happen next. Your child's reading record can be used to record a note of your reading with them at home but please make sure they are kept in your child's school bag so that adults in school can access them when recording the names of their new reading books. We will use our own records in school when listening to your child read.

Uniform/Appearance

We believe that the children should take pride in the way they present themselves e.g. shirt tucked in and top buttons done up. We *do not* permit hair gel, nail polish or jewellery besides plain studs and a watch and we would be grateful for your support in this matter. If hair is able to be tied up, then it should be at all times. The children are also expected to have clearly **named** indoor and outdoor shoes and **named** P.E. kit.
