

<p><b>Personal, social and emotional development</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Select and use activities and resources, with help when needed.</li> <li>• Play with one or more other children.</li> <li>• Become more outgoing with unfamiliar people, in the safe context of their setting.</li> <li>• Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Literacy</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Enjoy sharing books with an adult.</li> <li>• Enjoy drawing freely.</li> <li>• Talk about books and what they have just read.</li> <li>• Learn new vocabulary from books and begin to use it in their speech.</li> </ul> <p><b>Communication and Language</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To be able to listen for an increasing length of time.</li> <li>• To enjoy listening to stories and recall what they have heard.</li> <li>• Understand instructions with 2 parts.</li> <li>• Join in with singing Nursery Rhymes and songs.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Mathematics</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Quickly recognise a group of up to 3 objects without needing to count them.</li> <li>• Count past 5.</li> <li>• Show numbers on our fingers up to 5.</li> <li>• Say one number name for each item in order – 1,2,3,4,5.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Understanding the World Autumn 1 and Autumn 2</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Talk about what they see (inc. Forest school visits)</li> <li>• Begin to make sense of their own life-story and family's history.</li> <li>• Continue developing positive attitudes about the differences between people.</li> <li>• Know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or seen in photos.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Expressive Arts and Design</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Take part in simple pretend play, using an object to represent something else even though they are not similar.</li> <li>• Remember and sing entire songs.</li> <li>• Explore colour and colour mixing.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Physical Development</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Move freely with confidence.</li> <li>• Jump off an object and land appropriately.</li> <li>• Experiment with different ways of moving.</li> <li>• Explore malleable materials by patting, stroking, poking, squeezing, pinching and twisting.</li> <li>• Correct pencil grip and use scissors correctly.</li> <li>• Show increasing control over clothes and fastenings.</li> <li>• Thread beads, use peg boards.</li> <li>• Design and make structures with construction kits e.g. duplo, mobile, box modelling</li> </ul>
