Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the start of the spring term! We hope you all had a relaxing and enjoyable Christmas and are ready for a very busy term! Please make sure you check letters, boards and the school website for dates as there will be a lot going on. A good tip is to take a photo of the notice boards.

Attached to this letter are details of some of the things your child will be learning over the next term. Our topic this term will be <u>We are Storytellers</u>, where we will look at books (traditional, new, fiction and non-fiction), authors and hopefully get swept away in books and stories!

With regards to the building works, we are luckily fairly unaffected by all the work and will remain in our little bubble. What will change is how and where we drop off and collect.

Our session times will not alter as we are legally bound to 3 hours. Drop off will still be at 8.40am. This will be through the new gate and into the back door. There will be no member of staff on the gate as we will be manning the door and supporting the children in their regular finger strong activities. Please do bring your child into class, give them a little helping hand with their coats and bags and then settle them to a yellow hand task, as has been the case. Once they are settled, we will ask you to make a fairly swift departure back through the back door. The front door will be inaccessible and will be locked at this point. Please bear in mind that the garden is an outside classroom for us and will often be set up with activities that we do not have time to prepare during the session but need ready for the children. As tempting as it is for them, please do not allow your children to play with the resources. We will also remind the children that they should not be going on the climbing frame before or after school.

Collection will be as usual; the front door will open at 11.35 and children should be collected by 11.40am.

If there have been any childcare changes since last term please let us know as soon as possible. For your child's safety we can only let them go with yourselves or others you have informed us of so please take the time to let us know if someone else is collecting or if any phone numbers have changed. If circumstances change on the day please remember to call the school office as soon as possible so they can get a message over to us. Do call the school when your child is absent.

Some of our library books are getting damaged and dog eared as they are being put into children's rucksacks. Please purchase a book bag from us to avoid this happening. Please make sure **ALL** items of uniform/clothing are clearly labelled with your child's full name. This also includes hats, gloves and scarfs and coats. Also remember we go outside in all weathers, even snow, so your child needs to come into Nursery dressed appropriately.

Snack money for this half term remains £1.00 per week, £6.00 for the half term or £12.00 up until Easter. The preferred method of payment for snack money is school Gateway. If you are still paying by cash please make sure the money is in a sealed envelope with your child's name, class and amount clearly written on it. We appreciate the prompt payment of snack money.

## Acorn Morning

As per the weekly note, we are going to focus on a number a week. During these sessions we will look at the numeral, the array, the fingers, the amount of objects etc. Please look out for these numbers in everyday places e.g. dice, registration plates, door numbers, prices and encourage children to count objects and actions.

Please continue to return sound books every **Monday**, ready for the new sound to be added. A reminder to please name any items your child brings in for the sound table and to support them using the pure phoneme when searching for objects. Phonemes this term will be covered as follows:

As you may be aware throughout the year we compile a Learning Journey for your child. This evidences their progress in Nursery and how we help your child's development. If your child is hurt at home or on the way to school, please could you fill out a pre-existing injury sheet (yellow sheets on the inside notice board). This is to help us ascertain whether the children have had a knock at school and also makes us aware of any discomfort they may be experiencing.
