## ADOREMUS - 'Let us adore'

In assembly this term we have been learning about adoration of the blessed sacrament as part of the Eucharistic congress held in Liverpool recently. The Diocese have charged all of us to renew our Eucharistic faith during this year. Fr Carlos brought up the monstrance from the church and explained what happens during the adoration of the blessed sacrament and he will be leading adoration for Years 3-6 on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> October.

Fr Carlos celebrated our start of term mass last week and commissioned our new chaplaincy team who will work with all the pupils and staff to develop our Catholic life at the school. The standard of application for this role was once again very high and all the boys and girls in year 6 who applied should be proud of their applications and the effort they put into them. The chaplaincy members first task is to choose patron saints for our school houses…lots of options to choose from.

### **ENTERPRISE WEEK**

Next week classes from Reception to Year 6 will be off timetable and participating in our charity enterprise week. The pupils learn so much during this week and it is a great opportunity to be involved in real maths and real literacy for a purpose. Each class has been given a budget of up to £100 and the staff and pupils are keen to see who makes the most profit from that investment. Friday  $12^{th}$  is the enterprise week sale; a letter has already gone out about this. In previous events, we have run very low on stock by

halfway through the day, so it will be a learning opportunity for the children about stock levels and supply and demand if there is little to sell after school! All profits made from the enterprise week are going to the Across charity, which is a charity created specifically to provide transport and support to enable those with special care needs to go on pilgrimages to Lourdes. Currently Fr Carlos is with them on a pilgrimage with the parish.

This term we were delighted to receive a letter of commendation from the director of education services in the local authority for our fantastic standards and progress at the end of KS2. We were one of only eleven schools whose pupils achieved or exceeded 85% age related expectations and 30% greater depth in all SATs subject areas and whose progress from KS1 was high.
