Catholic life of the school.

Our great thanks to Fr Carlos who celebrated mass on St Joseph's day for the school. The chaplaincy team took a leading role in the Mass by sharing readings about and reflections upon the life of St Joseph. In addition, KS2 pupils had the opportunity to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation in school during Lent. This week KS1 and KS2 pupils took part in our Stations of the Cross liturgies, reflecting on the events of Good Friday. LKS2 RE homework also linked in with the Stations and the pupils once again put in a lot of effort to create their own favourite Station from home.

School Building Update

Unfortunately we have been delayed with our school building project as it is still awaiting planning approval. Having submitted planning in September, we have had to face new issues with the East Herts District Planning Officers regarding cutting of trees at the front of the school; the transport department deciding to undertake further studies due to late objections from the College and the environment agency wanting a different drainage solution for the new school. With some amendments made, we have overcome the issues of the trees and transport have lifted their objections to the project. However the drainage system is still an issue which the builders and designers are looking to change to ensure the project gets planning approval. Realistically there will be no building works this side of the summer holiday now. Life for the school will continue as normal and we will let you know further updates next term.

School Uniform

Please do take two minutes to check your child's uniform to ensure their name label is still clearly visible... unfortunately there is a large number of unlabelled uniform not claimed every week. Summer Uniform can be worn in the summer term through to the autumn half term.
