School Building Update

Finally I am able to share with you that we have had confirmation that the main building work will commence on the school site on January 6th 2020. Attached to this newsletter is a flier from Kier, our builders, which will be sent to the local residents in the near future.

In addition, we have included their plans for setting up their site compound. This will involve installing a path around the main school building and introducing a new entrance for Reception and Nursery amongst other works.

Safeguarding and Health and Safety of our pupils and staff is of utmost importance. Keir and the Department for Education are very experienced in school construction and all necessary safety procedures and risk assessments will be in place. Keir staff have enhanced DBS checks.

The plans shared for this two week phase can obviously change as building works do, but at least it gives you an idea of what will be happening. All of these minor works will be fenced in so that the children will be safe and we will have daily briefings with Kier to co-ordinate when breaks can happen safely.

Once Kier have set up the site- hopefully by 18th January 2020, we will need to make different arrangements for drop off and collection of the pupils as the pedestrian entrance to the playground will not exist and pupils will need to come in from the pedestrian gate by Nursery building.

Current Nursery and Reception children will have a new entrance leading to the outside area.

There will be a path around the main school building and we will need to operate a one way walking system. Registration time will be extended to 09.10 as it will take longer for pupils to get to their classrooms.

We will also have a 'soft' end of school day so parents can pick up their children between 15.15-15.30 from the classrooms to help ease congestion.

We will give more details towards the end of the first week once I actually see the works starting!

Advent Celebrations

KS2 pupils took the opportunity this half term to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation with Fr Carlos and to mark Advent with a special adoration of the blessed sacrament.

In a change from previous years, the EYFS performance was held at the Church with Fr Carlos this year. Over 80 angels, stars and shepherds walked down to church ready to retell the story of the birth of Jesus, supported by the chaplaincy team. The children did a wonderful job learning several traditional carols and sang them beautifully.

KS1 classes worked very hard on their nativity and gave two fantastic performances last week. I was so proud of their ability to perform so well to such large audiences under bright lights and without stage fright.

KS1 and KS2 classes held a lovely Christmas Carol service with readings, carols and music performed by our recorder groups, led by Miss Roper this week in the hall. Pupils were treated to a Christmas performance of the Nutcracker this week in KS1 and KS2 and EYFS celebrated with an entertainer and party. Wednesday was our Christmas Dinner lunch and Nicky Thompson and her team once again provided a lovely meal for nearly 400 pupils and staff.
