Dear Parents and carers,

We hope that you and your families continue to stay safe and well.

We have put together the work for this coming week for the children in Hazel, Maple and Oak Classes. The lessons have all been adapted for learning at home, and include guidance notes for some subjects.

You will find:

- 5 English lessons for Year 3 and 5 English lessons for Year 4
- 5 maths lessons for Year 3 and 5 maths lesson for Year 4, with accompanying worksheets
- 1 R.E. lesson
- 2 Design & Technology lessons
- Spelling activities
- PE activities - *Create a 10 mins energetic warm up for a sport of your choice.*

*Write down a list of the activities and then perform it in order. For example, for **tennis** you may include: jogging or running with changes of direction, stretching, twisting, bouncing on the spot, flexing and rotating wrist and ankles and swinging arms in a windmill shape to loosen up the shoulders. Remember that the warm up needs to prepare you for that **particular sport**.*

We would expect the children to spend roughly 60 minutes on the R.E., English and maths lessons. The lessons for the other subjects are a little more open, so can take as much or as little time as you can dedicate. Here is a suggested structure for the week based on research that has shown that children work more effectively in the morning.

Friday	English - Lesson 5 (longer) Maths - Lesson 5	P.E. activities
