Each lesson will build on from the previous one, so it's really important you complete them in order. Spellings will continue in the same way using Spelling Shed. The lessons consist of a video with slides. Each lesson begins with the teacher introducing what will be taught throughout the session. The slides will contain learning, recaps and the activities that you need to complete. Some of the lessons may introduce a key word or two.
