To describe different types of weather, make observations and understand changes around them.



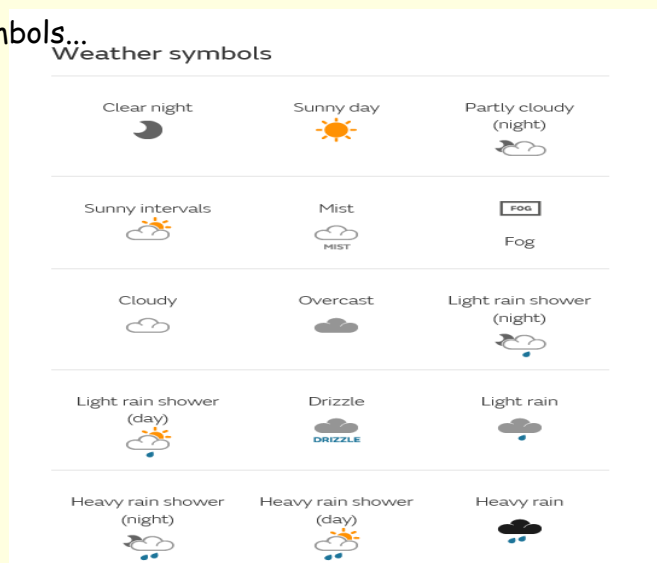

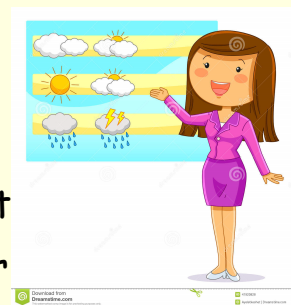
Looking above the clouds can help us work out what the weather is going to be like.
