School Building Update

Temporary Entrance to the school between 7th June -18th June

At the end of our 17th monthly building meeting this week, it was confirmed that the phase two building works are now about four weeks ahead of schedule. As long as everything goes to plan next week during half term, we will be returning to school with an operational playground and staff car park. The final works involve landscaping the area where the temporary car park is located in front of the admin offices. These works should take in the region of two weeks to complete with a date of 18th June as the final handover.

During the final building phase parents and pupils entering the school from Hadham Road will need to enter the site via the car park exit gate close to the old Nursery building. Just as in October of last year, staff will be on site prior to your arrival and the gate will be manned to ensure safe entry for all.

We still need to employ our current one-way system route around the school. The only difference will be to parents collecting both KS1 and KS2 pupils, who can now wait for KS2 in the playground as opposed to walking a loop of the school again.

School timings will remain the same after half-term as we still have to stagger entry and exit from the school site.

Report cards and consultations

I mentioned to the pupils in assembly today how proud we are of all of their achievements this term having read every single report card that went home. We are seeing progress in books again and the majority of pupils are really applying themselves. Hopefully, that came across during the parent consultations this week. We had a few technological issues for a small minority, for which I apologise. The school internet in the new building is much more reliable although, as we have all experienced in this last year and a half, things can happen beyond our control.

Reminders

Birthdays- As a school if your child is celebrating their birthday, sweets should not be given out as this does not promote healthy eating and some children in our school have food allergies. If you want to mark your child's birthday in school, we would always welcome a fiction or non-fiction book for the class library.

Mobile phones- the Local Authority are quite clear that parents should not be using their mobile phones whilst in the vicinity of children on the school site. This is due to the outcomes of serious case reviews regarding safeguarding, child abuse and protecting children online.

School Uniform- please check your child's uniform this half-term to ensure that their name is still visible in all of their clothes and PE kits. Jumpers are being taken off without any names or initials and whilst your child will know the smell of your washing powder, we don't!

Pupil Absence- if your child is absent from school, you must email the school or leave a phone message regarding this and the reason for your child's absence.

DINNER MONEY FOR JUNIORS

Please note: Dinner money must be paid in advance. School meal prices are £2.70 per day, £13.50 per week. You may pay any amount of your choice to keep your balance in credit. Please pay online using the School Gateway system. All you need to do to activate an account is download the school gateway from your app store or visit the website <u>www.schoolgateway.com</u> and click new user. You will receive a message with a PIN number and you can use this to log in. Please be sure the school office has your up to date email and mobile phone number.

Two weeks' notice in writing to our Catering Manager is required for any changes in dietary pattern.

Communication from HCC

Hertfordshire County Council have asked us to share the following update with you ahead of half-term:

Thank you all so much for playing your part and helping to keep case rates of Covid-19 low in Hertfordshire. During half term, and as restrictions ease more generally, it is more important than ever that we follow current guidance to help keep each other safe and our nurseries, schools and colleges free from outbreaks.

Please do not send children back into education if they are sick or feel unwell. If you or children have symptoms you must self-isolate immediately and book a PCR test at: <u>https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u>

Reminder of some of the latest guidance from 17 May:

- 6 people, or two households (each household can include a support bubble, if eligible) can now meet indoors and up to 30 people can gather outside
- If you are meeting with family and friends, the government is asking that you personally consider the risks associated with COVID-19 when deciding on things like wearing face coverings and social distancing for both you and your children
- Restaurants, pubs and cafes can reopen and so can indoor entertainment and attractions such as cinemas, bowling alleys, museums and children's indoor play areas. All of these services will have COVID-secure measures in place, please encourage your children to follow the rules when out and about

Travelling within the UK

If you do go away, you should aim to do so safely. For instance, one of our close neighbours, Bedford, has a high number of cases and people are being advised to avoid travelling in and out of the area unless it is essential (for work or education).

Travelling internationally from England

There are no longer any restrictions on leaving England to travel internationally, however to protect public health in the UK and the vaccine rollout, you should not travel to <u>countries or</u> territories on the red or amber lists.

If you do need to travel to an Amber destination for an emergency, you must update any setting attended by your child(ren) and;

- All family members who have travelled must quarantine for 10 days at home upon their return and can only leave home to take a test
- Paid for PCR tests must be completed by all those who have travelled aged 4 and above on day 2 and again on day 8 following your return

• Please do not send children back to nursery, school or college without completing the mandatory quarantine period
