COVID-19 Outbreak

Unfortunately we have had what is now classified as an 'outbreak' of COVID in the Year 5/6 classes. As a result of consultation with Public Health and HCC, additional measures will be re-introduced between Monday 1st November to Friday 12th November. Please see the attached sheet for more information.

Please note that:

- We are not planning at this point to change the already staggered start and end of school times for the two week window of additional measures.
- All Parents/Carers will need to wear a facemask whilst on the school site (unless exempt) from Monday 1st November.
- The emphasis is for all pupils to remain in school as normal. Public Health's current view is that we should not be sending bubbles home and reverting to home schooling.
- If a child displays any of the COVID symptoms, then please take them for a PCR test and await their result before sending them back to school. If the result is negative they can return to school if well enough. If it is positive, then they will have to self-isolate and return to school once the isolation period is over.
- Unfortunately, we have to postpone our planned Masses with Fr Antonio which were to commission the new Chaplaincy Team and Yr 4 FHC class masses.

Thank you in advance for working with the school to manage this outbreak of COVID.
