# **COVID Restrictions at St Joseph's**

Following on from our outbreak of positive COVID cases, as a school we are still having to enforce measures to restrict the spread of COVID within our community.

There have been improvements in Yr5/6 which mean we are now able to start clubs outside again for these year groups and they can become one bubble rather than three separate bubbles.

However, following meetings with Public Health, we still have to enforce the following in our school:

- Bubbles for EYFS/Yr1/Yr2/Yr3/Yr4/Yr5 and 6
- Phased break and lunchtimes for pupils
- No large in-person gatherings in the building- no assemblies, masses, meetings
- Facemasks to be work by all adults in the school
- Facemasks to be worn by all parents dropping off and collecting pupils from the school site

I had hoped this would have changed for the school by last week, but unfortunately, they are still to be enforced.

# **Report Cards and Parent Consultations**

Next week you will be receiving your child's autumn report card highlighting their strengths and targets to work on. This will be followed up in the spring term with a further report card highlighting progress before receiving an end of year report card in the summer term.

Due to the current restrictions we are unable to hold in person meetings or gatherings, therefore, we will be adjusting our EYFS and KS1 Christmas celebrations accordingly. As with last year, we will be celebrating with carols and readings in EYFS and Year 1 and having a traditional nativity in Year 2. These will be filmed and made available to parents online via a secure password at the end of the term. I understand that a lot of local schools are doing their celebrations in this way and some are still able to have parents in to watch, but unfortunately we do not have this option due to our COVID restrictions. However, this does mean that the pupils will be celebrating the season of Advent even more than in previous years, which is liturgically correct!

### COVID19

If your child displays any of the COVID symptoms detailed below, please follow the NHS guidance for obtaining a PCR test as soon as possible. He or she will then need to stay off school until the test result arrives - usually within 24 hours.

Once you receive the results, please contact the school, as we have to report the outcomes of PCR tests to Public Health.

If the test is positive, your child will need to self-isolate for 10 days. If the test is negative, they will need to return to school.
