### Safeguarding

At our school we work hard to ensure all our children are safe. On many occasions, this has involved working in partnership with the Local Authority and outside agencies. We are acutely aware of the additional pressures that families are under and the potential risks and challenges they face. Please keep the school informed if circumstances at home have changed so that we can look out for any changes in your child's behaviour or personality in school.

Sometimes we may need to share information and work in partnership with other agencies when there are concerns about a child's welfare. We will ensure that our concerns about our pupils are discussed with his/her parents/carers first, unless we have reason to believe that such a move would be contrary to the child's welfare.

Our Designated Senior Lead for Child protection (DSL) is Mr Peter Coldwell (Headteacher). Our Deputy DSLs are Miss Ann Cassidy-Jones (Deputy Headteacher), Mrs Saunders (EYFS Leader), Miss Kenny (KS1 Leader) and Mr Dove (KS2 Leader).

If you have a safeguarding concern, please speak with your class teacher or to Mr Coldwell or Miss Cassidy-Jones directly.

You can also share your concerns with Hertfordshire Children's Services on 0300 1234043.

If you feel that a child is in immediate danger, call the police on 999. You can report concerns to the police on their non-emergency number, 101.

### **Nursery Admissions for September 2022**

The application process for applying for a nursery place for September 2022 will open today, Friday, 11th February. This relates to children who reach their 3rd birthday between 1st September 2021 and 31st August 2022.

For Nursery, you only apply to the school using our application form. You do not apply to Hertfordshire County Council as well.

Half term COVID-19 'Relax and Vax' sessions for nervous teenagers
 Five of the larger vaccination centres across Hertfordshire and west Essex are
 running 'Relax and Vax' sessions during half-term week aimed supporting 12 to
 18-year-olds who are nervous about having their COVID-19 vaccine.

Specially trained staff will be on hand to help overcome worries like a fear of needles and answer any other concerns using simple and clinically effective relaxation techniques to help reduce tension and support them through the process. Children aged 12-15 need to be accompanied by a consenting parent or carer and just mention they are nervous on arrival so that the staff can make adjustments and they are given plenty of time and support.

People under 18 who have recently had COVID-19 must wait 12 weeks before having their vaccination.
