On Wednesday 18th May the members of the Chaplaincy Team led two assemblies on the theme of Pentecost.


They worked hard to produce PowerPoint slides and to engage the other children in reflecting on this great festival.

# **NOTE FROM GOVERNORS**

Our School Governing Body is made up of: 9 Governors appointed by the Church (Foundation Governors); 2 parents; 2 staff including the Head Teacher; 1 appointed by the Local Authority; and 2 Co-Opted people. We currently have Bob Sherfield and Miles Edwards as parent Governors. Governors are appointed for 4 year terms and parent Governors can complete their 4 years after their children have left. Miles is appointed until August 2017 and Bob is appointed until August 2018. At the moment we have 1 vacancy for a Foundation Governor and we will have another in September. We have carried out a skills audit and, although our Chair is a Solicitor, we would like to have more Governor with legal skills on the team. One other rule that we are bound by is that we cannot have more than 2 parents as Foundation Governors. We currently have 1 and so we can only seek 1 more parent Foundation Governor. If you have legal experience and you are a practising Catholic and you have the time to commit to being a Governor then please contact our Chair, Suzanne Fitzgerald, to discuss the matter further. If you know of someone who is not a parent of a child at our school and who fits this description then please pass this message on to them.

Please note that the role of the Governors is a strategic function to:

- a. Ensure clarity of vision, ethos and direction;
- b. Hold the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and

c. Oversee the financial performance of the school. We are not here to get involved in the day to day running of the school, which is our Headteacher's responsibility, unless it is relevant to the above. In the last Newsletter we informed you that we had appointed Ann Cassidy-Jones to be our new Headteacher in Deputy September. congratulated Andrew Price on his appointment as a Deputy at another school and now we have to congratulate Stacey Brown as she too has been appointed as a Deputy at another school. This left us with a large recruitment responsibility but we are very pleased to let you know that we have filled the roles of all the Key Stage Leaders from

Our efforts also continue to convince the local authority that St. Joseph's should become a 2 form entry school. This would provide 15 more places for each year group. With thousands of houses starting to be built in Bishop's Stortford, the argument must be made. On average 10% of families moving into these new houses will be Catholic. These new families are likely to want a place in this school for their children. We are already oversubscribed and we are going to have to turn away more practising Catholic parents in the future. We pray that the local authority will agree to fund this expansion. We will let you know when we hear.
