#### From our Governors:

## **TOP PERFORMING PRIMARY - SUNDAY TIMES**

We were delighted to be listed 85<sup>th</sup> in the whole of England for our end of school SAT's results over a 3 year period. That is 85<sup>th</sup> out of about 17,000 primaries. These are fantastic results and we congratulate our Headteacher, Peter Coldwell, all the staff and the pupils.

## **GOOD NEWS**

We have received funding under the Priority School Building Programme (PSBP) to have a new school building built at last. The plans are still uncertain but we hope that the actual building work will take place during the academic year 2017-18 so that we may be able to move into our new building during the academic year 2018-19. We have many questions outstanding which we hope will be answered in the next few months and so we cannot provide any details yet. We will keep updating you via this Newsletter.

Whilst we are making plans for our new school building we are trying to convince the local authority that St. Joseph's should become a 2 form entry new school. This would mean that the local authority would need to fund the difference in the building costs to increase the size. If we were a 2 form entry school we could provide 15 more places for each year group. With thousands of houses starting to be built in Bishop's Stortford, the argument should be made but the local authority has not confirmed their agreement. On average 10% of families moving into these new houses will be Catholic. These new families are likely to want a place in St. Joseph's for their children. We are already oversubscribed and we are going to have to turn away even more practising Catholic parents in the future. We pray that the local authority will agree to fund this expansion. We will let you know when we hear.

### **SPORTING NEWS**



### **CHRISTMAS FAYRE**

Christmas came early for St Joseph's when the School Association's efforts raised more than £1,000 at the Christmas Fayre.

The organisation of this year's fayre, on Friday December 2<sup>nd,</sup> was taken over by committee member Sam Soames for the first time.

Families came out in force to support the event, with many parents and also teachers volunteering to look after stalls, man the door, help set up for the fundraiser and clear up afterwards. There was a good range of stalls, food served and a great atmosphere. Sam said: "Thank you everyone who volunteered and everyone who supported the fayre. Your help and support was fantastic and, importantly, the children seemed to really enjoy themselves." The exact total raised will be known once it is added to the money from the iPad draw and luxury raffle.

### **CAKE BAKES, QUIZ AND DISCO**

New and regular events have helped continue to raise funds this term. Newly-elected co-chair Andy Faulkner organised the first quiz in recent years with former Bishop's Stortford Observer editor Paul Winspear taking on the role of quiz master.

The disco was another success with teachers kindly stepping in to run it again. The children danced the afternoon/evening away and raised £831.
