He spoke to the children about the three practices of Lent: praying, fasting and giving alms, and reminded us of the importance of living out these practices in a thoughtful way as we prepare for Easter. It was lovely to witness the prayerful and reflective atmosphere as we received our ashes and thought about how we could welcome Jesus into our lives.

As St Joseph's Day (19th March) happened to fall on a Sunday this year, we celebrated our patron saint on Friday 17th March, along with Saint Patrick! In the morning, Fr Fortunato led Mass and discussed the important role that Joseph had in looking after Mary and Jesus. He taught us that, like Joseph, we should try to be more willing to listen to the word of God in our daily lives. The afternoon was then filled with exciting activities, including making cards and researching the life of St Joseph. The annual Fr Hanton memorial football and netball tournaments that take place to mark St Joseph's Day were thoroughly enjoyed by all who took part. 
# CHAPLAINCY TEAM FUND RAISING FOR THE FOOD BANK

Thank you all who brought in coins to 'top up our tins' in school.


#### **BOOK FAIR**

The year 5 and 6 children have finished their term of tennis with Ali. Year 1 and 2 children will be starting after Easter. As promised, the results of the LKS2 BSP Gymnastics competition - Miss Roper came back to school beaming as the children had performed incredibly well and were placed mid-table. This is a very daunting competition as the calibre of performance is high and there is individual pressure. The children are expected to memorise 2 floor routines and a vault jump and deliver these individually in front of a judge.

#### **NOTE FROM GOVERNORS**

The Board of Governors take our legal responsibilities to ensure Equality and Accessibility very seriously. To this end we have a rolling 3 year plan of consultation, action and review. To ensure that our curriculum is rich and diverse, research is currently ongoing into the preferred programme for PSHE, a decision to be made at the end of the current academic year. New schemes of work have been introduced in Science, History, Art, Design and Technology and Geography enriching the experience of the pupils. There is significant input from the Chaplaincy Team extending to the pupils who have raised funds for Cafod and the food bank.

The school newsletter will continue to be used to communicate with parents and there is an intention to conduct a survey among parents to seek views on how the school implements the Equality Duty Act.

To improve communication and enable our non-verbal children to access the learning environment, one of our staff members, specialising in speech and language, has provided a programme of support for parents. Two members of staff have been on autism training. There has been extended use of the speech and language therapist for pupils highlighted by the school.

Plans are in place for a new school building when accessibility for all pupils will be highlighted.

On the new school building front, many meetings have been taking place to try and finalise what we have funding for to include in our new building. Hertfordshire County Council have been extremely helpful. Although some issues have not been finalised at the time of writing, what I must point out is that we are going to need as much fund raising as possible over the next few years. We are going to get a brand new school building but there is no additional funding for anything that is not part of the building. This means that there will be no funding for any new furniture; expensive white boards; or outside play equipment for example. We will all need to do our best to raise as much as we can so that the new school is as well furnished and equipped as the new building itself.
